Welcome back from the October half-term. The winter months are finally on their way – but do not let the chill in the weather affect your attendance.

There are so many good reasons for you to be at College. We are pleased that 95% of our learners who completed our recent Induction Survey have told us that they are enjoying their lessons so far! We want to ensure that you are all having a positive learning experience. 100% attendance and punctuality is essential if you want to get the best possible grades!

There are some wonderful trips and activities being planned over the next few weeks. Many of these are linked to your course and will increase you knowledge, experience and also be fun.

Speaking of fun, I hope by now you have made some good friends at the College and that you are encouraging each other to stay on track. Sometimes studying a course can be stressful, but if you ask for help from your teachers, support staff or friends/family you will succeed.

Both Adults and 16-18s will now also be receiving their bursary payments – all subject to excellent attendance. This month we are introducing a new cashless payment scheme for your meals in the College canteens. We want all 16-18s (who are eligible) to claim their free meal allowance – see your Tutorial Learning Coach or Course Leader.

We are helping more learners to fulfil their career goals! We have so far this year dedicated £443,502.40 to learners in support of Childcare (excludes funds for January and April starts). This compares with the total 2013/14 allocation of £462.297.13.

This year we have been able to ensure that the majority of learners were able to begin the term with childcare support compared to previous years. This demonstrates our commitment to supporting our learners.

Access students visit the London Access Higher Education Admissions Fair

On Friday 24 October 39 Access students attended the London Access Higher Education Admissions Fair held at Central Hall, Westminster.

With 54 higher education institutions (HEI's) from across the UK in attendance students had the opportunity to speak with knowledgeable recruiters and get answers to some burning questions to smooth their progression into higher education. As the event was exclusively for Access students HEI's were well prepped and able to answer even the trickiest questions (e.g. What childcare support is available when I'm on a night shift placement? Unfortunately, the answer was "None", but it was good to have a definitive answer in order to make an informed decision).

There was also the chance to attend a series of workshops, from "How to make an effective application" to "Everything you wanted to







know about nursing and midwifery". The outcome was that it has enabled Access learners to make the best possible choices to give them the best possible chance of making a successful progression into HE.

BTEC Fashion students visit Fashion Retail College

A group of very ambitious fashion students attended the Fashion Retail College Open Day last month to find out more about their Level 4 and 5 courses, apprenticeships and employer links.

Students were impressed with the central location, state of the art facilities and their Vogue magazine back catalogue. The visit was rounded off with a trip to the world renowned fabric shops in Berwick Street were students were able to collect fabric swatches for their new designs.

Students reported that the day had really inspired them and helped them appreciate the importance of fashion to the London economy.



Black History Month

The Student Union organised a Black History Month Showcase aptly titled 'Rep Your Heritage' on the 21st of October in the Clapham HUB. The event was attended by over 150 students and showcased the talents of various learners as well as highlighting the rich cultural heritage and contributions that black people have made to society all over the world. It was also an event to celebrate the diversity of Lambeth College and encourage learners from all backgrounds and walks of life to wear something to the event that represented their own culture and heritage.

The Student Union members entertained the audience with a short play about slavery which was very insightful and thought provoking, they also had two outstanding singing performances which brought the crowd to their feet! In addition, there were two dance routines as well as three learners performing rap songs.

At the start of the Showcase and in between performances, TLC's Shane Dennis and Kevin Garvey inspired the audience with great quotes from Black icons such as Bob Marley, Marcus Garvey, Maya Angelou and Barack Obama.

Feedback from the event has been very positive, with the common theme being learners really enjoyed it and hoped the Student Union would be putting on more such events to help enrich their college experience.

One learner said: "It was wicked! We need to make this a regular thing".

Another learner was quoted as saying she really enjoyed it and it had inspired her to get involved with college activities.

All in all, a successful event, which the learners enjoyed


